Participation with fellow veterans, the Oak Meadows Therapeutic Riding Center staff and program horses, and specially selected and trained volunteers allow participants to learn and grow at their own pace.

Focus on the tasks at hand reintegrate and reinforce reasoning and decision-making abilities. With the horse as gentle partner, cognitive skills are enhanced while preparing for and participating in activities that include learning about the horses, and equipment.
